Ride Reports

Sunday 19th September The M & P Ride



Another wonderful morning greeted an enthusiastic gathering of riders. The ride brief was conducted with an introduction of new rider Martin, and with Philip leading with Marie nominating the corner marshalling points, 17 bikes left Top of Taps and travelled to the east. Chandlers Hill, Cherry Gardens, Ironbank, Stirling, Uraidla, Basket Range, Lenswood, Lobethal and into the Woodside CFS car park for morning tea. Those interested wandered around to the Lovells bakery. The first part had its share of corners, some sharper than others, but some great scenery. We travelled through country roads with paddocks, a high hedge of trees and assorted wildlife. I think Marie counted 812 sheep, 622 cows, (both of varying colours) horses, bulls, a variety of birdlife and no doubt a few other furry little creatures.

After morning tea, we travelled from Woodside to Brukunga, Nairne, skirted Mount Barker, Wistow, almost to Strathalbyn, Macclesfield and Meadows.

Once at Meadows some went to Pic a Pie for lunch, some to the Meadows Hotel and others just wandered off to their homes. The second part had more straights and a little speed ending up entering Meadows via Greenhills Road.

Due to a phone call from Lesley (Goldwing trike) on the evening before the ride a last minute change was made to the ride. Coming from Strathalbyn on the Long Valley Road we were going to turn left into Gemmels Road. This turn is where an overtaking lane finishes and two lanes of traffic merge into one. It is a designated black spot with three fatal accidents in the last four years. The local knowledge of Lesley was important for rider safety (Thank you). Any members planning rides in the future should bear this matter in mind.

Sunday 3rd October Stephen Robert's Ride



Lead by Stephen, the magnificent seven braved what threaten to be heavy showers for the Sunday ride. Luckily it turned out to be just the occasional drizzle and no heavy downpours. Well done to all those who decided to ride.

Sunday 17th October John Green's (Roundabout) Ride



We left Willunga and headed towards Strathalbyn. Between those that left at Willunga and those that joined in at Strathalbyn there were about 30 bikes. It was a beautiful day for riding. We travelled to the Victor Harbour Road and on to Mount Compass, left on to the Nangkita Road and then to Bull Creek Road, Ashbourne Road in into Strathalbyn for morning tea. This part had long straights with lovely sweeping bends, the bends into Strathalbyn were particularly enjoyed by some of the riders of smaller go fast bikes. By the time we reached Strathalbyn it was obvious there were a lot of other groups large and small on the road riding. We left Strathalbyn on the Paris Creek Road and

manoeuvred the horrible 45 degree right turn as it joins the Bull Creek Road, through Meadows and right towards Echunga. By this time the group was riding well in convoy, albeit annoying cars that also wanted to use the road. Into Hahndorf where we did a quick left and right, made easier by pedestrian lights, and then onwards through Lobethal to the very large Rocking Horse at Gumeracha for lunch. Some had not seen the rocking horse before and spent time looking to avoid any large piles of rocking horse (*&^ This had been another section of sweeping roads and some generous straights. There was one minor issue at a roundabout (of all places considering it was Roundabouts ride) on the Lobethal Road in that a couple of "fair weather riders" had mixed in with our convoy thus causing a few issues in some following the wrong bike. During the ride we saw lots of farm animals, deer and assorted wildlife, some of which seemed to enjoy flying between oncoming bikes and coupled with smell of three fires at different farms.

Great time, great weather, great ride. Well done Roundabout.

For those who were away for the weekend or weeding garden beds you missed a good ride. See you soon.


